ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST MARCH 2024

This is the acting Chairman's report to the 37th Annual General Meeting of the Friends and 21st Annual General Meeting of the Charity as required by our constitution. The objects of the Friends are to advance the education of the public in Maldon and the surrounding areas by providing support and assistance to Thomas Plume's Library (Registered Charity number 1179957) through activities and projects and in such other ways as the Executive Committee may from time to time determine. In planning our activities, the Trustees have kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Membership of the Friends now stands at 132 each paying a subscription of £5, supplemented by generous donations. We are very grateful to members of the Friends and The Arts Society Blackwater who continue to help in the Library with cleaning of books and fitting book shoes. This work is vital to the maintenance of the Library. We would also like to thank the Friends who have made individual donations to the Library, for book conservation, fundraising merchandise and equipment, fixtures and fittings.

We are also grateful to members of the Friends who assist as stewards for the school visits to the Library by pupils at The Plume Academy and on the annual Heritage Open Day in September.

The Friends were pleased to be able to arrange a full programme of events and fundraising in the year ended 31st March 2024.

The 2023 AGM was held on 20th May 2023 in the D'Arcy Room at All Saints' Church in Maldon. At the AGM, no nominations were received for the post of Chairman, which had been vacant since the 2021 AGM. As a result, committee meetings have continued to be chaired by members of the committee, on a rotating basis. Two new members, Rachel Wood and Frank Garcia, were elected to the committee at the AGM. After the end of the AGM, we enjoyed a most interesting talk by Julie Miller about Essex Quakers.

On 10th July 2023 a group of 23 Friends visited the Pepys Library and the Old Library at Magdalene College, Cambridge. In the morning we were shown around both libraries by the Pepys Librarian, Dr Jane Hughes. The Pepys Library contains a unique collection of 3,000 books and manuscripts, which was bequeathed to Magdalene by Samuel Pepys, a graduate of the College, and is a rare example of a 17th-century private library which has been preserved as Pepys left it, with no additions or disposals. The Old Library is Magdalene's own collection of rare books and manuscripts which has evolved throughout the history of the College. In the afternoon members enjoyed free time in Cambridge.

The Plume Library was open on Saturday 9th September 2023 for the Heritage weekend. The Library had an interesting exhibition for visitors of books from the 'Pamela' collection. The Friends helped with stewarding and also ran a bookstall on a very hot day in the churchyard which raised £191, less than in previous years. Attendance at the bookstall tailed off in the afternoon, but 85 people visited the Library during the day. Many thanks to all those Friends who helped with the bookstall or acted as stewards on that day.

We held our annual quiz at Maldon Town Hall on 3rd February 2024. Frank Garcia was quizmaster for the third year and produced an entertaining quiz, which was very well attended and

raised £1,037 for the Friends. We are grateful to the Mayor of Maldon, Cllr Andrew Lay, for choosing the Friends as one of the charities given use of the Maldon Town Hall without charge this year.

The books purchased for Thomas Plume's Library during the year to replace those on the 'missing list' are listed at the end of the report, 10 books in total. In June 2023 The Friends of the National Libraries made a generous grant of £3,812 to Thomas Plume's Library to supplement our own funds, and we were able to purchase 4 books for the Library at the 4th auction of books from the Fox Pointe Manor Library. At the end of June another book came up for auction and we needed to raise funds quickly, Individual members of the Friends responded very generously to a fundraising appeal at short notice, donating a total of £3,010. In January we were able to purchase 3 more books at the 5th auction of books from the Fox Pointe Manor Library.

The Committee (Trustees) has met four times during the year. We are grateful to all members of the Committee for their help and support during the year.
